






What is EAPPI?


A just end to the occupation of Palestine (West Bank, including East Jerusalem, and Gaza) based on international law.

"I felt grateful for the support I received...it gave me hope. Seeing [EAs] in the court gave me strength."


"The soldiers are more controlled when you are here. When you are not here, they do what they want."

- 2011 Meeting for Sufferings: boycott of products made in Israeli settlements in the occupied West Bank
- 2014 YM 'Gaza statement' including recognising the state of Palestine, and a comprehensive arms embargo on Israel, Hamas and all armed Palestinian groups
- 2018 Trustees and Meeting for Sufferings: commitment to not invest in companies profiting from the occupation
- 2016-2024 campaigning against the anti-boycott bill
- Since October 7:
 - Immediate and permanent ceasefire by all sides
 - Release of all hostages
 - Renew funding to UNRWA
 - Ending UK arms sales to Israel
 - Unhindered humanitarian aid into Gaza
